RE: Executing Estate Documents in Canada in 2020: Covid-19 Amendments and How to Effect Safe (And Valid) Signings

STEP Canada has prepared a resource chart for its members to reference the options for having documents signed in each province and territory. While the normal requirements still remain valid, provinces are, in some cases, making available alternatives to signing documents while abiding by physical distancing requirements. The chart is not intended to replace the complete language of each applicable statute, and there may be technicalities specific to your province or territory not included. However, the basic signing provisions are included in an effort to provide guidance in this uncertain time with respect to executing estate documents and ensuring they withstand judicial scrutiny if later challenged. In this unprecedented time, there is room for creativity to the benefit of estate practitioners.
